PRINCIPAL AND VICE-PRINCIPAL HOURS- Mr. Allaby and Mrs. Rodger share a Grade Two classroom. Mrs. Rodger teaches Language Arts for the first 90 minutes of the day which provides time for Mr. Allaby to be in the office each day and he will be available to talk to students and parents at this time. Mrs. Rodger is available after 10:20 each day.

ALLERGIES: SCENT FREE AND NUT FREE SCHOOL

<u>PEANUT BUTTER-</u> There are children in our school with severe peanut allergies. It is necessary to impose a ban on peanut butter in sandwiches, cookies and other sweets. Thank you for your cooperation regarding this matter. <u>We are a PEANUT FREE SCHOOL.</u>

<u>SCENT FREE SCHOOL</u>- Many public places are now scent free. All schools are scent free and students are not permitted to wear perfume products.

BUS TRANSPORTATION - The district has changed their policy for transporting students and they will only transport students to the same location every day. If you need a form for alternate transportation such as pick up at your home in the morning and delivery to a babysitter after school please ask your teacher for the Alternate Transportation form. <u>District</u> <u>Office will NOT allow us to accept notes from parents requesting for the</u> <u>student to go to their friend's house after school. There are no exceptions to</u> <u>this rule.</u>

SCHOOL WEB SITE - The school has its own web site that is being revised. Lakewoodheights.nbed.nb.ca NUTRITION POLICY - The District Education Council has developed a Nutrition Policy which was fully implemented on January 1, 2006. This policy ensures that all schools have a strategy to provide students with access to healthy food choices at school. The vending machine that is in the cafeteria is there mainly for the benefit of outside groups who use the building and often is out of order. Please do no rely on this for drinks for your child. Students are only permitted to purchase the water or the 100% fruit juice. This policy is to help students make healthy choices and they are asking that parents help with this by thinking about Canada's Food Guide to Healthy Eating when preparing lunches. We are asking that <u>pop or mini sips</u> not be sent in lunches as they have no nutritional value. We try to send home the food your child does not want to eat so that you are aware of what they are eating. Please monitor how much you send as sometimes food is wasted. Please make sure whatever you send can be opened by your child. Ex: Oranges need to be peeled and split for them. The boxed lunchables, although they look appealing are often wasted by students and are seen half eaten in the garbage. The school has nutritious food on hand to provide students with food to eat if they arrive without breakfast or a lunch. We will only provide healthy nutritious choices to the students.

MILK PROGRAM - Chocolate and white milk is provided at school. To keep things simple, students will pay for their milk for the month. A separate notice is included regarding dates and prices for the months ahead. We have to place our order on Thursdays so need to have all money on Wednesdays. Please hold on to this notice. YOU MAY PAY FOR LONGER PERIODS IF YOU WISH. Please remember that Cheques for Milk Money cannot be combined with Lunch money as the Home and School do not look after Milk Money.

RECESS AND LUNCH BREAKS - All students are required to go outside during these times. Many times children come to school without proper clothing on. I ask for your help in seeing that appropriate clothing be worn to school throughout the school year.

SECRETARY'S HOURS – Susan Ward– Cornect is our secretary and she works 36 1/4 hours a week from 8:00 – 4 pm each day. PARKING - Please do not <u>drop off</u> students at the front door of the school as this is the drop off for the buses only. Please do not park on Lakeview Drive as the Crossing Guard cannot cross the children safely with cars parked along this road. Vehicles <u>MUST</u> park in the back lot and come into the building from there. <u>You are not permitted to park in the TRAFFIC CIRCLE</u> at the back of the school as again this is not safe for children who are getting dropped off. This is strictly a <u>DROP OFF</u> zone only. <u>There are parking</u> <u>spaces behind the fence if you need to come in.</u>

These rules are for the SAFETY of your children. I thank you for your cooperation. Teachers will ask you to move your car if you are in violation of these rules.

SICK CHILDREN - If your child is sick and will not be in school please call us to let us know. When a child becomes ill or injured at school we will try to make him/her comfortable and we will call you to make you aware of the situation. You may be asked to come and take your child home, so it is very important that the teachers have alternate numbers for calling during these situations. The demands of the teacher make it almost impossible to care adequately for children who are sent to school sick so please do not send sick children to school. If your child has medical conditions such as asthma, diabetes, severe allergies or any other conditions where special medication is involved, please inform the school so that we can make all staff aware.

TALK MAIL – This system we use is called "School Connects". This system will allow all families to receive our messages regardless of their phone carrier. We will be sending home phone messages as well as email messages so please add your email to the contact form if you wish to receive emails through this system.

TERRY FOX RUN – Thursday, September 27, the children will take part in our own walk for the Terry Fox National School Run Day. We are asking the children to bring in any donations during that week in support of the Terry Fox Foundation. HOT LUNCH PROGRAM - HOT LUNCH WILL BEGIN MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 24th AND MONEY MUST BE IN BY THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 20th. The Home and School looks after the Hot Lunch program at the school. It will be offered five days a week and all orders must be placed by THURSDAY of the previous week. We will send home items and prices in the near future.

SCHOOL RULES - You will see our Code of Conduct below. Please review this with your child. Our aim is for Lakewood Heights School to be a safe place for children. Physical fighting is not permitted at our school. Students will be sent home if they choose to fight to solve their problems. There are always teachers on duty and children should always feel safe. I tell them if they are in a dark alley and feel their life is in danger they may need to protect themselves but we really feel there is no need to fight at school in order to solve their problems on the school grounds. All students will receive training on Bullying and how to handle this but we strongly encourage all parents to contact us if they feel there are any problems with Bullying. We ask for your cooperation regarding this matter. If students choose to use violence to solve their problems you will be notified and they will be sent home.

CELL PHONES AND OTHER ELECTRONIC DEVICES- In support of the policy from the district office on the use of cell phones and other electronic devices Lakewood Heights School is asking that students do not bring these items to school. School District officials believe that maintaining the integrity of the learning environment is a priority and that the use of cell phones and/ or electronic devices might detract from that priority.

HOME AND SCHOOL- The Home and School is a very active group at Lakewood Heights. The Home and School meet monthly and will be looking for new members to join them. Parents help by passing out hot lunch each day as well as in the Library. The district has made it MANDATORY that all volunteers must have a Criminal Records check done and filed at the school. SCHOOL PICTURES- School Picture Day is on Thursday, October 11th.

SCHOOL HOLIDAY-Please note there is <u>NO SCHOOL</u> on <u>Tuesday October 9th</u> as this is a District Based Professional Development Day for all schools in District 08.

KEEPING OUR SCHOOLS SAFE- Safety is the number one concern at all schools. During the day ALL of our doors are locked and you must be buzzed in to enter the building. Students who arrive late must enter through the front only. Doors are unlocked at recess and lunch time. All parents must report to the office AT ALL TIMES when they are entering the building.

NATIONAL ANTHEM- District schools will be playing the National Anthem each morning.

PHOTOGRAPHING STUDENTS FORM- Please read and sign the form indicating whether you will allow your child to be photographed. Our main use is for the slide show at the end of the year but occasionally local photographers are invited to events and students are photographed.
